Revision of the German maritime spatial plan in accordance with § 17 of the Spatial Planning Act (ROG) for the exclusive economic zone (EEZ) of the North Sea and Baltic Sea and the strategic environmental assessment according to § 8 ROG

- Notification according to § 9 para. 4 ROG in conjunction with §§ 60 para. 1, 54 Environmental Impact Assessment Act (UVPG), Art. 10 SEA-Protocol (ESPOO), Art. 7 Directive 2001/42/EC and bilateral agreements if applicable

Dear Sir or Madam,

With the approval of the Federal Ministry of the Interior, Building and Community (BMI), the BSH carries out the preparatory procedural steps for preparing the maritime spatial plans for the exclusive economic zone (EEZ) of the Federal Republic of Germany. According to § 17 para. 1 ROG, the maritime spatial plans for the German EEZ have to include provisions to ensure the safety and ease of navigation, further economic uses, scientific uses and the protection and improvement of the marine environment, while taking into account any interactions between land and sea and safety aspects.

In addition to guiding principles for the spatial development of the EEZ, the current maritime spatial plans (Ordinance on Spatial Planning in the German Exclusive Economic Zone in the North Sea (AWZ Nordsee-ROV) of September 21st 2009 and Ordinance on Spatial Planning in the German Exclusive Economic Zone in the Baltic Sea (AWZ Nordsee-ROV) of December 10st 2009) provides for spatial and textual provisions for the objectives and principles of spatial planning. As part of the **preparation for the revision of the plan**, the BSH has produced a concept with three planning options.

According to § 8 ROG, a strategic environmental assessment (SEA) of the maritime spatial plan is required. implementing the maritime spatial plan on the marine environment. At the beginning of the SEA process, the content, scope and level of detail of the environmental report are defined within the scope of the assessment (see § 8 para. 1 sentence 2 ROG). The draft of the scoping document will be presented at a scoping meeting. The authorities whose environmental and health responsibilities are affected by the plan or programme will be invited to give their opinion in defining the scope of the assessment.
